Innovation:

Developed a community-based model to address mental health issues experienced by local rural communities effected by the drought and exacerbated by the 2006/07 bushfires

Was the first practice in the region to introduce Nurse Practitioners

Commitment:

Worked tirelessly over 10 years supporting public health awareness campaigns on Teen Binge Drinking, Drug Abuse and Skin Cancer

Supported the Maternal and Child Health Nurse with the New Mum's Breastfeeding Program

Worked closely with the local council to upgrade facilities to encourage and support, undergraduate medical students, registrars, locums and overseas trained doctors

Completed the GP Diploma (DRANZCOG) in 2002 to support visiting consulting Obstetricians

Leadership:

An active member of the local rural division of general practice (including being the Division Chair for seven years and Deputy Chair for five)

Introduced registrars into the practice and provided 10 years of support as a supervisor, medical educator and mentor to placed registrars

Successfully lobbied the State Government to support the establishment of an After Hours Service for the district

Chairs the After Hours Service Committee of Management and local hospital Board
