### **Calling the community - have your health say**

Residents of Koondrook, Barham, Kerang and Cohuna are invited to participate in a community discussion looking at solutions to their health workforce shortages.

On Wednesday March 10, from 5.30pm consultations are taking place at the Kerang Valley Resort with groups including local hospitals, medical staff and concerned community members to look at ways to bolster health services access.

Local general practitioner and regional Workforce Shortage Committee member Dr Peter Barker speaks of the event's importance.

"We encourage community members to participate in the discussions. Our towns need sustained health services and together we can better position the services available.

"Our combined effort will see a regional approach to attracting, recruiting and retaining health professionals through a number of initiatives that have worked in other regions similar to ours.

"Most importantly, we anticipate the collaboration will result in the development of a regional after hours GP service and we hope to increase the number of teaching opportunities for medical students."

Murray Plains Division of General Practice (MPDGP) chief executive officer Matt Jones explains the need for a coordinated approach.

"GPs are in short supply and in high demand throughout the State.

"We need to discuss ways to improve access to and sustain our health services for the benefit of our communities."

Return bus services will be provided at no cost from Barham and Cohuna to enable community to access this important meeting, and dinner will be provided at the event. RSVPs are essential.
