

## An Introduction to cultural safety in Aboriginal health for students

### Grant Application Guidelines 2017

#### Background

In collaboration with Victorian Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Organisation (VACCHO), RWAV is offering grants for students to attend “An introduction to cultural safety in Aboriginal Health for students”. The grant covers course registration and lunch. This does not include travel and other expenses which need to be borne by the student.

#### Applications

Applications will open on Monday 9<sup>th</sup> October 2017 and close on Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> October 2017 at 9am. Late applications will not be considered. Notification of outcome will occur within 2 weeks of applications closing.

#### Eligibility

Students must be studying for a degree in medicine, nursing or allied health disciplines at a Victorian University campus

#### Preferences

Preference given to those who have completed or are completing Clinical Placements in a rural location during their degree. Rural locations are defined as RA2-5

Preference will be given to those who show a good understanding of rural and Aboriginal health and commitment to working in a rural and/or Aboriginal health setting upon graduation in their responses.

Preference will be given to those who are a member of a Rural Health Club if one exists at their university

Students must be available to attend the full day workshop at VACCHO in Collingwood on Wednesday November 22<sup>nd</sup> 2017.
