HOW YOU CAN PREPARE

- Spend some time before you relocate and get a feel for the place.
- Use the internet to find out about population, climate, regional characteristics and local attractions.
- Consider how you might respond to the challenges you may face e.g. bushfires, limited resources, isolation.
- Secure a reliable car, which can cope with all-season travel
- Get to know the health provider networks in your location, including:
 - Local referral networks
 - \circ Cultural groups that influence practice
 - \circ Gain an introduction with key community leaders
 - o Get involved in workplace and community social events
 - Understand how local industry (agriculture, fishing, mining, etc) influences the needs of health services in your area
 - \circ $\;$ How your health service caters to specific community needs
- Use modern technology to stay connected to your loved ones, as well as your professional connections, such as any professional associations you belong to.
 - \circ $\,$ Catch ups with people from your training cohort via Zoom $\,$
 - \circ Linking with professional contacts online when you have clinical questions
 - \circ Attending remote CPD events
 - \circ $\,$ Keeping in contact and up to date with peers and mentors through social media $\,$

CHAT TO YOUR EMPLOYER

Your employer can provide you with an introduction to the health service, offer insights into the communities' health needs, cultural groups and the vision, structure and policies of the health organisation.

QUESTIONS TO ASK

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- What kind of cases or conditions are most prevalent?
- Who in the team would be good to ask about [clinical question, specialty, etc]?
- What is the cultural make up of this community?
- Who should I speak to if I have concerns or ideas?
- What other providers/information services are available?
- What does everyone enjoy doing in this community?

CULTURAL COMPETENCE

Culture shapes how we all perceive health and wellbeing, how to stay healthy and what to do and where to turn to when we are ill.

Cultural knowledge

- helps to build client-clinician rapport,
- allows the clinician to put in place effective treatment plan that encourages compliance
- promotes positive health outcomes.

RWAV can support your cultural competence journey:

RWAV has collaborated with the Victorian Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Organisation (VACCHO) to facilitate free of charge <u>Cultural Safety Workshops</u> for primary healthcare providers and support staff in rural Victoria.

Build your cultural competence as an organisation through a Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP). Your practice may be eligible for a RAP Grant, to provide financial assistance in developing a in partnership with Reconciliation Australia.

Health Workforce Scholarship Program

The Health Workforce Scholarship Program (HWSP) is designed to improve access to services needed in remote and rural areas across Australia by supporting an increase in skills, capacity and/or scope of practice. The HWSP provides professional development support to health professionals in rural, regional and remote Australia.

Medical Professional Development Program

The Medical Professional Development Program (MPD) supports the ongoing professional development and medical education of medical practitioners in rural and regional Victoria. MPD also aims to encourage trainee doctors to complete rural and regional placements by providing access to professional development subsidies. The MPD is funded by the Victorian Government and administered by RWAV.

This Grant supports allied health practitioners and nursing professionals working in MMM2 areas to access educational, professional and skill development opportunities.
