

# An Introduction to Cultural Safety in Aboriginal Health Training for Students

## **Grant Application Guidelines 2018**

#### **Background**

In collaboration with Victorian Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Organisation (VACCHO), RWAV is offering grants for students to attend "An introduction to cultural safety in Aboriginal Health for students" training course/workshop. The grant covers course registration and lunch but does not include travel and other expenses which need to be borne by the student.

### **Applications**

Applications will open on **Monday 26<sup>th</sup> February 2018 and close on Monday 12<sup>th</sup>March 2018 at 9am.** Late applications will not be considered. Notification of outcome will occur within two weeks of applications closing.

### Eligibility

Students must be studying for a degree in medicine, nursing or allied health disciplines at a Victorian University campus

#### **Preferences**

- Preference given to those who have completed or are completing Clinical Placements in a rural location during their degree. Rural locations are defined as MMM 2-7.

- Preference will be given to those who show a good understanding of rural and Aboriginal health and commitment to working in a rural and/or Aboriginal health setting upon graduation in their responses.
- Preference will be given to those who are a member of a Rural Health Club if one exists at their University

#### Requirements

- Students must be available to attend the full day workshop at VACCHO in Collingwood, Melbourne on Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> April 2018.
