

RWAV CAREER COACHING GRANT

GRANT OVERVIEW


The RWAV Career Coaching Grant supports General Practitioners, allied health practitioners and nursing professionals to access support in career planning and exploration of the options available to them. This will enable participants to make informed career decisions based on their unique set of circumstances, life goals and skills. The sessions will assist with goal setting and career development.

This grant is available to health practitioners working in an MM3-6 location, in private practice or in an independently registered and managed community health service in Victoria.

The career coaching sessions will be delivered by Lesley Armstrong. Lesley is a highly regarded careers coach and counsellor. She works with individuals at all ages and stages to help them increase self-awareness with respect to their interests, skills and values; and identify options for work-life satisfaction and transitions.

Details of the program include:

- Up to 2 x 1 hour Career Coaching sessions
- · Delivered online with a qualified career coach
- A limited number of places are available until 31 May 2021
- The content of sessions is private and confidential; no feedback will be provided to an employer or other parties
- Participants will be contacted directly by the Career Coach to book in the sessions
- Participants will be expected to complete some homework prior to the session to maximise the benefit of the session, these homework questions are for reflection and not intended as written responses
- Any change to the session time must be discussed with the career coach within a minimum of 24 hours' notice or the session will be forfeited by the participant
- If there is a cancellation prior to 24-hour notice, the participant may be able to reschedule their appointment
- An evaluation will be emailed to the participants following the completion of the sessions.

Applicants must be Australian Citizens and Permanent Residents:

- In Private Practice or independently managed Community Health Service
- In a rural or remote area MMM 3-6
- · Have worked in rural Victoria for a minimum of 5 years
- · Currently working in rural Victoria
- · Have a current AHPRA number.

APPLICATION PROCESS

- All applications must be made through the RWAV website, www.rwav.com.au
- Applicants will receive an agreement letter that must be signed and returned to RWAV before any sessions can be booked with the career coach
- The participant will be contacted by the career coach to book in mutually convenient times for the sessions
- Participants will be expected to complete some homework prior to the session to maximise the benefit of the session, these homework questions are for reflection and not intended as written responses.
